

A.S.K. – Apollo Supporting Kids

The A.S.K. program is a joint school staff and community effort to identify, assist and support all students who have actual or potential problems that may interfere with academic or extracurricular performance. The main goal of A.S.K. is to identify students whose behavior, attendance, health or grades indicate that they may have problems or be “at-risk”. Faculty, staff, and parents will be able to notice and respond to students who are exhibiting difficulties and refer them for help through the A.S.K. Core Team. The Core Team is composed of teachers and school staff members who have been trained to receive referrals and to intervene in a student’s problematic pattern of behaviors and offer assistance. All requests for Special Education Services must first be referred through the A.S.K. program. The A.S.K. program is an important component of the P.B.I.S. system, as it is designed to provide targeted interventions for those students who, for one reason or another, are having difficulty adjusting to the behavioral or academic expectations of the school.
